- Dignity & safety for the user
- Suitable for air freight
- Low cost
- Quick, simple & high quality

Latrine Superstructures Better experience for the user

- More durable than plastic sheeting & poles

Dunster House

- Larger toilet cubicle option
- Long roof for rain runoff
- Very durable
- Wooden frame repairable locally
- Double size accessible version




AMG Group

- Material more durable than plastic sheeting
- Packs small and light
- Assembled in < 4 minutes
- Wind resistant









Trench Linings

- Collapsing soils
- Primarily for trench latrines


Dunster House

- 2 cubicles long
- 120cm wide
- Much greater volume than a normal trench latrine
- Slab sits on wooden frame



Oxford Plastics

- 80 x 120 cm panels
- 85 cm wide
- Flexible in how it's used



Evenproducts

- 2 cubicles long
- Extension kit available
- 100cm wide
- Slab sits on soil

Raised Latrines

- When pit latrines aren't possible
- Requires desludging

Dunster House

- Timber frame
- Desludge via hatch at back
- Excreta tank 1m³/cubicle

Access platform

Flexxolutions

- Metal frame
- Reusable
- Excreta bladder 0.8m³/cubicle
- Desludging through zip in bladder

Evenproducts

Desludging

- To fit on any pickup or flatbed
- Effective with a variety of pit latrines

'ROM'

- Can be placed on any truck or pickup
- Outperformed diaphragm pump
- 800 litre vacuum tank
- 3" hose copes with some rubbish
- Water tank with pressure pump and special nozzles for 'fluidising' sludge
- \$24,000
- 400kg



Handy Wash

- Water conserving
- Convenient & easy to use

Version 1

- One touch handwashing device
- No cross contamination
- Low flow to conserve water
- Fits on any bucket
- Currently in use & available to buy for \$8

Version 2

- Valve requires less force
- More durable
- Development ongoing









Household Toilets

- For household, primarily urban, use
- Suitable for use by people unable to use latrines


Mosan

- Urine Diverting Toilet
- One bucket for poo, one for pee
- Cover faeces with ash, sawdust or soil
- Easier to handle than single bucket of wet sludge
- Prototype stage
